Gateway to Gigha

Another month has sped by on Gateway and, with just one month left to go, various aspects of our project are nearing completion. As I write, Scott and his team are completing the finishing touches to the Druimyeon Bay Link. Sadly, we won't be able to open this route until we fulfill the Council's Roads department's conditions in our planning permission, which is to produce a tarmac-surfaced, kerbed pavement at the campsite end, with bollards and tactile paving. This work is scheduled to take place in the third week of May.

Elsewhere, other finishing and tidying work has been ongoing and a few more fingerposts will be popping up shortly. It is a massive disappointment to me that we haven't managed to complete all our planned paths entirely, but we have succeeded in creating several kilometres more length of routes than was included within the original scope of the project. Gateway, I believe, will continue to develop and there are already plans to enhance the existing network.

In terms of our heritage interpretation, panels and wayfinders are currently in production and are due for dispatch in the first week of May. They will be fitted or installed during the remainder of the month, so that by the month's, and project's, end, things will look a lot more like the finished article.

I look forward to updating you one final time at the end of the month.





Gigha Ranger Service

Conservation volunteers have been hard at work making the roadside at Grianan more beautiful. A local resident had the wonderful idea of planting the area with wonderful wildflowers, so we have spent the last few weeks pulling up bracken, aerating the soil and sowed wildflower seeds. Forest School was also another success this month. The children went foraging for springtime edibles, and tried out a blindfolded taste test. All of the children were absolutely fantastic and identified everything they tasted – we have some serious plant experts on our hands!

We have also held our final event in the Community Heritage Project through Gateway to Gigha. Kilmartin Museum came to Gigha for the second time to present their mini museum of artefacts from across Argyll, give us the opportunity to try out some Bronze Age pottery. Gigha Primary also showcased their work from their Bronze and Stone Age topic and Kilmartin's previous visit working with the children to learn about a day in the life of a person in that period, and become bone detectives, looking at skeletons to understand disease, occupations and health of our ancestors.


