Isle of Gigha Woodland Management Plan

In 2022, IGHT engaged consultants, TreeStory, to produce a Woodland Management Plan with the purpose of providing habitat recommendations and the legal documentation necessary to carry out restricted thinning/felling. TreeStory conducted a community consultation in early 2024, and the Ranger Service held a presentation in the Village Hall in March 2024. The IGHT Woodland Management Plan has now been approved by Scottish Forestry and is available to the community at the IGHT office. The approval of the plan does not mean that this work is guaranteed to take place, but it is a legal framework that IGHT must comply with if any woodland management work is to happen.

The plan includes woodland compartments that are managed by IGHT only. The plan does not include woodland compartments outwith IGHT managed land, as this would have imposed strict, numerous, and potentially expensive legal regulations on land tenants. If land tenants wish to do any work at all to woodland compartments, those tenants will need to go through a similar process and apply for their individual felling licence/plan from Scottish Forestry, which is a legal requirement.

Woodland Management Plan Vision:

The long-term aim is to diversify and improve the health of the woodlands through thinning plantations and managing invasive species. The non-native plantations will be gradually converted to Continuous Cover Forestry (CCF) systems, creating diverse mixed woodlands which can provide a modest timber supply for the island, wildlife habitats, recreational and aesthetic benefits. The vision for the Achamore Gardens woodlands is to use CCF management to establish the next generation of trees and ensure the long-term survival of these woodlands and the gardens they protect.

Management Objectives:

| No. | Objectives (including environmental, economic, and social considerations) |

| 1 | Begin the process restructuring the conifer plantations, using thinning interventions, to create more species and structural diversity. |
| 2 | Where appropriate, restructure the conifer plantations to create more multipurpose woodlands which can provide a modest timber supply alongside ecological and recreational benefits. |
| 3 | Maintain and enhance the woodlands surrounding Achamore Garden, which provide essential shelter to the garden. |
| 4 | Improve the ecological health of the native scrub woodlands. |

Which lead budding detectives to stops around the garden, providing clues to decipher and revealing a mysterious phrase. Anyone needing a break and some refreshments could retreat to the tea tent, which was well stocked with a lovely selection of home baking. There was also the chance to build and bring home beautiful bouquets of flowers, hand picked from around the garden.

Island Ranger Service

What a long month, with wet, warm days, midges galore, and what seems like endless strimming! However! We have seen more bats this month than any other this year. July is the time when mamma bats are feeding their young in maternity and nursery roosts. Two eagle-eyed residents found this poor thing on the road just recently, and whilst definitely full size (pipistrelle bats grow no more than 5cm!), this one could have been a young one trying out flying, but perhaps not succeeding. It is always sad to see a deceased animal, but a real privilege nonetheless to see these creatures up close.



Other winged friends this month have been the plethora of moths that have been out on display. Beautiful tiger and ermine months have been spotted, as usual, at Gigha Natural Skincare, and our second summer programme event, Moth Morning, was a beautiful start to the day. We only had a few participants but what we lacked in humans, we sure made up for in moths. Some of the species we found included 7 small magpie, 1 poplar hawk, numerous buff ermines, 7 footman, 1 mottled beauty, 8 yellow underwings, among many, many others.







Island Ranger Service continued

Volunteers have also been hard at work this month. We had our annual Kilchattan clearance which saw the volunteers rally to action to remove evergrowing, persistent fuchsia, cleaning the gravestones, carefully cutting back the grasses in the chapel, and tidying up the graveyard edges. It was a great turnout, and the site looks a million times better for it.



Beach cleaning has also been on the agenda, with volunteers following in the wake of the awesome island children clearing marine litter from Poll Mor. A total of four CanAm loads was taken off the beach, making our coastal areas a little bit safer for wildlife.



One of the more frustrating aspects of the summer is the constant cleanup on our beaches of abandoned camp sites, tents, food, wipes, full doggie poop bags, and hot fire remnants. This year seems to be particularly bad, despite so many wildfire incidences across Scotland and the number of warnings from Scottish Fire and Rescue Service. That being said, our Scottish Outdoor Access Code leaflet illustrated by Adam Murphy has been flying out of the leaflet holders at the Visitor Hut, so hopefully we are spreading the "responsible visitor" advice.

Dark Skies Gigha's Annual Perseids Party August 8th - 10th 2025

Friday August 8th In the Night Garden

Join us for tea and a fun and friendly afternoon session in the lounge of the Gigha Hotel on the theme of designing and planting gardens for nighttime stargazing and sky watching. We will be joined by well-known local garden designer and writer Rachel Bailey who will share some of her secrets for planning a garden for evening and nighttime enjoyment and wellbeing, not just for humans but for many pollinators and night creatures. Learn about planning outdoor spaces which are safe for stargazing and which keep light pollution to a minimum.
