Household Resilience

Fyne Homes and Inspiralba have secured investment from Scottish and UK Governments to support householders as living costs rise and the need for environmental sustainability increases. Leighann Burns has been appointed as the Household Resilience Advocate for the island. After receiving training and working alongside partner organisations, Leighann is able to help residents to access a range of support to residents who may be struggling to deal with issues such as fuel poverty, benefits queries, housing problems and debt advice. Leighann is able to refer directly to organisations who can provide free confidential information on grants, fuel vouchers and explore eligibility for heating and insulation measures as well referring to other avenues of support such as Kintyre Foodbank, Kintyre Recycling Uniform Project and Employability Programmes. Renewables

GGPL has received a credit note from Enercon relating to their 21-22 financial year which covers part of the downtime experienced between November 2020 - March 2022. This is for a value of 28,000 Euros. This will mean that all compensation owed from Enercon will be paid up to date. 129,838.44 Euros was already claimed for 19-20 and 20-21 downtime. GGPL is still progressing an insurance claim for the loss of Feed in Tariff from the 2020-2022 downtime period. A draft figure of £250k has been shared previously.

BPP-TECH have secured funding from the "Hydrogen Innovation Scheme" for the "GHigha: Green Hydrogen for the Isle of Gigha" project. The scope of the project is for BPP-TECH to assess the techno-economic feasibility of producing Green Hydrogen on the island using new renewable energy sources.

The GREL board have started working with SKS Scotland to progress the feasibility of replacing the Dancing Ladies following their initial Options Appraisal. SKS Scotland have sub-contracted Felix Wight and Joe Smee to work on the project, who both have technical and community energy experience. They intend to work with Colin Anderson again also. The next stage will be to do further research on the turbine specification before arranging planning and community consultation. The Trust has secured £25,000 from HIE to support the succession planning of GREL.

T2 update:

Arrangements with Vestas for the gearbox change out are on-going. There have been delays in acquiring the gearbox as due diligence to protect both Vestas and GREL from any risks has been required.

Tests have been done on the crane pads to ensure the ground conditions are suitable for the gearbox lift and the internal fall arrest systems within the turbines have also been tested prior to works going ahead. The gearbox change out is now expected in mid-June.

Gateway to Gigha

After two and half long, challenging, but ultimately very rewarding and enjoyable years, the Gateway to Gigha Project is drawing to a close. You might have noticed a late flurry of activity this month, with the appearance of the road junction between the Coastguard station and campsite (a requirement of Planning Permission), the installation of further fingerposts, and the fitting of our long-awaited interpretation panels to the stone plinths. At the time of writing, there are still a number of items to attend to - the wayfinders (secondary interpretation lecterns) to install, for example, and small-scale improvements and developments will continue across the network. There is also the possibility, and certainly scope for, further footpath development, depending on future funding opportunities.

For now, though, I am bowing out as Project Manager, but I will retain a huge personal interest in the path network, in this amazing island, and the many great people I've had the pleasure of meeting during the course of the project. It's been a massive privilege to have been invited to play such a key role in this brilliantly conceived project and I'd like to thank all of you for allowing me this honour. It's been a treat to have spent so much time here, and I'm pretty sure I won't be able to stay away for long!

Gateway to Gigha

I hope many of you will enjoy, or continue to enjoy, our path network - now more than 20km of routes in total! – the interpretation points, and, for some at least, our fleet of ebikes.

BAKKAFROST SCOTLAND - WEST GIGHA - PROJECT UPDATE

Bakkafrost Scotland would like to provide the following updates on the West Gigha proposed fish farm development.

SEPA Update

The formal SEPA Controlled Activities Licence (CAR) application was submitted to SEPA on 19 April 2023.

This application was made under the Water Environment (Controlled Activities) (Scotland) Regulations 2011 (CAR). The application process will determine whether or not to grant a CAR licence for the Proposed Development based on the comprehensive information that we have prepared and supplied throughout the pre-application process.

A key aspect to the SEPA application determination process is consultation between SEPA and statutory consultees (such as NatureScot and Marine Scotland), as well as people and organisations whose interests may be influenced by the Proposed Development. In the event that SEPA grant the application for a CAR licence, this licence will ensure that discharges from the Proposed Development are within the assimilative capacity of the receiving marine environment, thereby ensuring no significant effect on the water environment.

Planning Update

Since the public engagement event, held in February 2023, we have continued with the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) for the Proposed Development and incorporated views raised by the community into this process.

In response to interest from the community, we propose to hold an additional engagement event. This event will specifically cover the EIA process itself and the mechanisms through which EIA operates to ensure development is sustainable and sensitive of the receiving environment. We will also take this time to reiterate the specific aspects under consideration within the EIA.

A summary of the SEPA Regulatory Framework will also be provided, with attention focused on the mechanisms for ensuring the Proposed Development operates within the assimilative capacity of the receiving environment.

It is proposed that an event will be held in June 2023.

Dog Fouling

IGHT contacted Argyll & Bute Council to enquire about free dog foul bags, which had been raised by a member at the last members meeting. 2000 bags have been ordered for Gigha by the Council's Amenity and Dog Control Warden. These will be available around the island in addition to the dog poo bag dispensers already in place.

Achamore Gardens

We kicked of May in style with a trip to the Scottish National Rhododendron show, organised and run by our friends at the Scottish Rhododendron Society. The show was well attended as always, with plenty of entries in all the classes. It was only our second year at the show, so I was absolutely gobsmacked to discover that we'd managed to win 7 first places and lift a grand total of three trophies, including the Scottish Rhododendron Society Cup which is awarded to the Best Hybrid Rhododendron in the show! The awards are a testament not only to the current garden team's hard work, but also to the gardeners of the past who planted and nurtured these amazing plants for us to enjoy now.
